Karl Schärer, Heidelberg:

- suggested that some kind of structured organization should be given to the working group.

Alan Watson, Nottingham:

- in favour of giving a formal structure to the group
- proposed joint or satellite meetings with ESPN and/or IPNA
- lower costs and easier access to funds from sponsors

Tom Lennert, Berlin:

- introduced himself as a "representative of cosiness"
- has worked successfully as it is for 27 years
- sceptical that we needed to change

Joachim Rosenkranz, Heidelberg

- information about fund-raising
- "more a matter of limits than of opportunities"
- would be worth trying to get funds from the programme "Training and mobility of researchers (TMR)" supported by the European Communities.

Link with ESPN

- Meetings could be held as satellite meetings, along side ESPN scientific meeting, OR
- Fully integrated with ESPN?
- Venue, website, catering, etc organised by ESPN
- More attendees to hear about psychosoc issues (but doctors)

EU Funding – Nottingham

- The COST programme
 - Co-operation in Science and Technology (COST) Action
 - could offer one off (termed ‘pay as you go’) funding for events, or more long-lasting support
 - does not pay for the actual research; but pays to facilitate meetings, conferences etc attended by the researchers
 - requires a minimum of 5 countries, with one lead country
 - In Nottingham, agreed that UK, Germany, France, Netherlands, Hungary, and others would participate
- Agreed that one very general, over-arching "research" topic would be: "Improvement of psychosocial care and outcome in European children and adolescents with renal failure"
- we are all doing this research most of the time

EU Funding - Nottingham

Sally Elkes, senior European Policy Manager, NHS European Office

- *“The issue that EWOPA would have is that COST aims to support new, innovative and interdisciplinary scientific networks. As EWOPA is an existing network, it would be probably be necessary to find a new angle - e.g. generating a new output such as European guidance”*
- *“To support individual researchers who need financial assistance to fund their attendance at the conference, consider Marie Curie Actions (<http://cordis.europa.eu/fp7/people/>).”*

EU Funding - Nottingham

- General discussion about ability of individual units to fund a Researcher, or research project
 - eg ECH used an existing psychology graduate who undertook the Nottingham project as part of her training
 - other units may not have such a person and may need extra staff to conduct research
- Discussion about whether those centres who cannot afford to undertake higher-level research could do simple qualitative research on the same theme eg
 - Presentation by nurse in Nottingham looking at experience of renal failure through photography
